




BACKGROUND

- Trauma is common in our society
- Healthcare providers are well suited to recognize and respond to youth who have experienced trauma but lack adequate training on trauma-informed care (TIC) and resilience
- PATCH offers youth-driven educational programming for providers and teens, aimed at improving adolescent health
- TIC and resilience principles could be integrated into PATCH trainings, serving as a bridge for this gap.



Investigation Phase

- Literature review and 10 expert interviews conducted to gain a strong foundation of TIC and resilience
- Ideal-state curricular objectives regarding TIC and resilience developed

Evaluation Phase

- Objectives-centered approach used to evaluate PATCH materials on their fidelity to these objectives
- Nine interviews with PATCH stakeholders conducted to gain insight on optimal integration of TIC and resilience principles into its program

Synthesis Phase

- Evaluation findings summarized into a Strengths, Weakness, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT) Analysis
- SWOT analysis used to create five key recommendations for PATCH

RESTULTS

- Evaluated PATCH curricula currently does not explicitly address many objectives related to TIC and resilience

- Key stakeholder takeaways supported these evaluation findings.

KEY RECOMENDATIONS
