Medicaid (BadgerCare Plus, MAPP, Katie Beckett, WCDP):

Wisconsin Medicaid provides healthcare coverage for parents and children, and includes programs for those with chronic illnesses or disabilities needing long-term care.

HealthCare.gov (Affordable Care Act):

HealthCare.gov Marketplace plans cover pre-existing and chronic conditions, with financial help for those who qualify.

Job-based Insurance:

Many people have health insurance available through a job, including a spouse's or parent's employer. Talk to your employer to confirm what they offer.

If the monthly premium is more than 9.96% of your household income, you may qualify for financial help on HealthCare.gov.

Compassionate Allowance Conditions:

There are two groups of congenital heart patients included under the Compassionate Allowance Conditions. Your submission for SSDI will be reviewed more quickly if you meet certain qualifications. The following are the Compassionate Allowance Conditions for congenital heart patients:

All single ventricle patients

These are individuals who have only one working ventricle (pumping chamber) in their heart. It includes anyone who has undergone a Fontan procedure.

The listed diagnoses are:

- *Hypoplastic Left Heart Syndrome*
- *Mitral Valve Atresia*
- *Single Ventricle (not covered above)*
- *Aortic Atresia*
- *Pulmonary Atresia*
- *Tricuspid Atresia*

All Eisenmenger Syndrome Patients

Eisenmenger Syndrome refers to patients born with many kinds of heart defects whose defects are not fully repaired.

Their symptoms include:

- *Chronic low oxygen levels*
- *Clubbing of the fingers*
- *Problems with blood clotting*
- *Blue lips*
- *Pulmonary hypertension*
- *Persistent cyanosis (blueness)*

Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI):

Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) or “Disability” provides monthly payments to people who have a disability that stops or limits their ability to work.
